

# Laura Hart's Spanish Moon Moth

The Spanish Moon Moth meticulously and painstakingly created by Laura Hart from Sudbury was selected to be shown in the prestigious Glass Life Forms 2016 Exhibition at the Pittsburgh Glass Centre.

"This is a huge honour, I'm still pinching myself," beams Laura who has just returned from Pittsburgh after delivering the glass moth. "The exhibition is in tribute to the famous father and son team of the 19th and 20th centuries; Rudolph and Leopold Blashka, who created plant and invertebrate glass models for Harvard University's Botanical museum."

The exhibition is at the Pittsburgh Glass Centre until May when it will tour to New York's Corning Museum of Glass to coincide with the Glass Art Society Conference.

Laura's moth is a truly lifelike entomological specimen created from fused glass wing sets, pate de verre cast body with sterling silver legs and antennae. Taking up to six weeks to perfect, all Laura's butterfly and moth specimens are unique.
