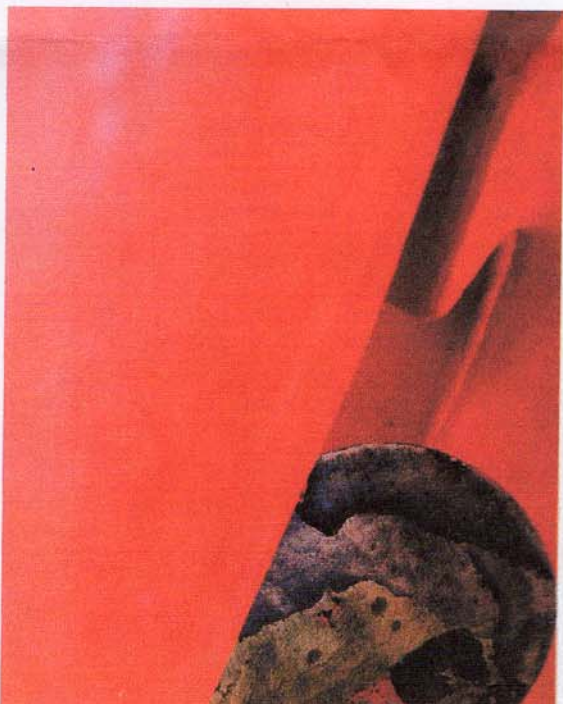
Lin Williams in Falmouth

Local artist Lin Williams' solo exhibition, *Colours Of Cornwall*, is now at Greenbank Hotel, Falmouth. "With its fresh new rebrand and our close connection with the water we thought that Lin's work would fit perfectly with our hotel's warm and traditional feel," says Lena Waite, corporate sales manager at Greenbank Hotel. We think she's right. Williams, a self-taught artist, experimented initially with watercolours, oils and acrylics before adopting pastels. She thrives on seeing the changing light, seasons and colours. "I never tire of walking my favourite haunts looking and watching for that special moment that will draw my eye," she says. This exhibition brings together his personal work as an artist, where in photography and sculpture, he looked to the infinitely subtle and surprising signs of decay on the natural and man-made environment for inspiration.
